## WORK METHODOLOGY

For the development of this work face-to-face and remote meetings have been held with different associations and foundations, in addition to emails and telephone calls. Information has been gathered about the actions that are taking place in the destination of the city and its surroundings. On those actions planned or foreseen that have a positive impact on the city regarding the SDGs. The actions have been classified with reference to each of the SDGs goals.

Also, additional actions have been valued that various companies have communicated. This report looks at the data that was able to be gathered, and it may contain deficiencies due to lack of information, and what should be assessed is the capacity for improvement and evolution that set destinations can prove and that serves as a pathway to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda.

Meetings were held with different agents from the city in which they defined in each case the methodology for gathering the necessary information.

## SDGs ANALYSIS

In 2015 the UN approved the 2030 Agenda on sustainable development, an opportunity so that countries and their societies can start a new path with which to improve the lives of all, leaving no one behind. The Agenda has 17 Sustainable Development Goals, which include from the elimination of poverty up to combat climate change, education, woman's equality, the defence of the environment or the design of our cities.

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) constitute a universal appeal to the action to end poverty, protect the planet and better the lives and people's perspectives worldwide.

Currently, progress is being made in many places, but, in general, the measures aimed to achieve the goals are not moving fast enough nor are on the needed scale. 2023 should mark the beginning of an ambitious post-pandemic stage in order to reach the goals for 2030.

It channels its support through entities with social and educational purposes that serve the most vulnerable and at-risk or excluded groups, with special attention to minors, and care for the environment.</p> <p>To this end, the purchase of school supplies, clothing, footwear, reading books, musical instruments or collective games is facilitated through schools and associations rooted in the area.</p> <p>Through 30 organizations, more than 1,500 people are served, including minors and their families, women at risk and their families, and immigrants with a desire for social and labour inclusion.</p> <p>By providing healthy breakfasts and/or snacks in the centres, the nutrition of minors is reinforced, and school absenteeism is reduced.</p> <p>By providing clothing, school supplies, footwear or sports equipment at school, training is reinforced as the main way to fight poverty, improving their well-being and integration opportunities.</p>

The financial allocation to each club will be the result of multiplying this amount by the number of underage athletes licensed in the federation up to a maximum of €4,000.</p> <p>For clubs that have male and female licenses for minors distributed between 40 and 60 percent, the maximum grant will be €5,000.</p>

**DESCRIPTION**

WELLBASED is a European H2020 project whose goal is to design, implement and evaluate a comprehensive urban program to reduce energy poverty and its effects on the health and well-being of citizens. 7 European pilots participate, including València, which also coordinates the project.

Within the project and under the creation of the Citizen School for the Right to Energy, about 177 people in situations of energy poverty will be attended, with advice and personalized attention. Another group of 177 people in energy vulnerability will be the “control group” to which surveys will be carried out to know in detail their situation and design public policies that help combat the phenomenon of energy poverty.

**WHAT IS THE CITIZEN SCHOOL FOR THE RIGHT TO ENERGY?**

The Citizen School for the Right to Energy was born from the European project WELLBASED and aims to reclaim and raise awareness among all citizens about the Right to Energy.

Among its main purposes are:

- Helping households in the city of València to empower themselves energetically
- Advising on how to save money on energy (electricity, gas)
- Improving people's physical and mental health

How do we achieve this?

- Expert and personalized advice
- Training workshops
- Group meetings
- Open talks
- Activities to strengthen the associative fabric of the city

The School wants to be a benchmark when addressing this right through the visibility and de-stigmatization of energy poverty; a structural issue in our society that must be addressed and resolved collectively.

**WHICH ORGANIZATIONS ARE PARTIES?**

The Citizen School for the Right to Energy is managed by the City of València through the València Clima i Energia Foundation and its Energy Office, with the collaboration of the Las Naves Innovation Center.

**ENERGY AND HEALTH**

Health is usually recognized as a basic right. However, access to affordable and secure energy is not recognized as such. Having (or not) enough energy to meet basic vital needs has a major impact on people's physical and mental health.

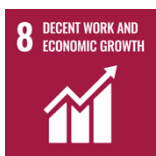

This is achieved through the implementation of "Citizen Hubs", unique windows that offer advice and support with the technical, administrative and financial problems that the residents of the city encounter during the rehabilitation processes of their buildings and homes.</p> <p>The Valencian pilot is focused on the Energy Office as a one-stop information on energy rehabilitation in the city. Currently, the Energy Office addresses questions related to this area, whether through individual counselling appointments, informative workshops for several people, or the production of different teaching materials.</p> <p>Within this framework, one of the actions proposed for the València pilot is the creation and dynamization of the "Citizen School of Energy Rehabilitation", which in its activity programs aims to be an open, free and flexible group of people interested in energy rehabilitation. <b>DESCRIPTION</b>	<p>Recording the sounds of birds is a way to enjoy them while improving their knowledge and contributing to education, science and conservation. In L'Albufera, it is a very interesting activity, since it is one of the main areas of presence and migration of birds in the western Mediterranean.</p> <p>At Fundació Assut, we have launched the Ornit (Nocmig Albufera) project, dedicated to recording and studying the nocturnal vocal activity of birds in La Devesa.</p> <p>The method consists of making night-time recordings throughout the year and analysing them by viewing the track in spectrogram mode.</p> <p>The measure favours each year a large group of species that seek their food in silt and mud and among which are some in serious decline in Europe, such as the black-tailed godwit, the combatant and the curlew sandpiper. Other waterfowl, such as gulls, herons, terns, ducks, Ibis, and flamingos, also benefit.</p> <p>In addition, the benefit is double, since with these agricultural tasks the adventitious vegetation that develops in the failed rice fields is controlled and the annoying presence of weeds is reduced during the following season. To do this, each year, during the rice growing season, between May and October, it locates the rice fields where planting has failed and, in agreement with their owners, pays for a series of jobs on these plots that make them favourable enclaves for many species, necessary spaces for survival.</p> <p>These failed plots, conveniently "puddled", clarified and slightly flooded, constitute small islands of life in the dense and impenetrable sea of rice. The measure favours each year a large group of species that seek their food in silt and mud and among which are some in serious decline in Europe, such as the black-tailed godwit, the combatant and the curlew sandpiper. Other waterfowl, such as gulls, herons, terns, ducks, Ibis, and flamingos, also benefit.</p> <p>In addition, the benefit is double, since with these agricultural tasks the adventitious vegetation that develops in the failed rice fields is controlled and the annoying presence of weeds is reduced during the following season.
