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INTRODUCTION

València is a city that is each day more Accessible, intelligent and sustainable. Committed to sustainable development goals, it is pioneer in the world in measuring and certifying the carbon footprint of the tourism activity to therefore search for actions that reduce and compensate it.

In addition, tourism generates a competitive advantage over intangible values and differentiation from competition. Therefore, public administrations (regional, provincial and local) and also businesses must strive to adopt sustainable tourism practices.

The sustainable approach to human activity has and will have a place in any territory or society, since it means taking a step forward in the constitution of a transformative strategy, focusing specifically on people, with goals that can be agreed upon and shared.

This is how the SDGs, inheritors of millenium development goals, face the coming years (2030). And tourism, present directly in the goals 8, 12 and 14 must contribute positively to the achievement of this great challenge, to end poverty in all its forms everywhere and transform lives and to protect the planet.

The Valencian Tourism Community considers that this is the route to follow, propelling the transition towards a change of mentality about tourism and its management model.

Derived from this common task, the need to promote the minimization of the impact of the activities that take place in the city of Valencia has emerged, betting on promoting the SDGs. For this the same procedure is carried out in the form of a catalogue to identify and to be able to contribute with different associations, foundations and companies to collaborate with them.













WORK METHODOLOGY

For the development of this work face-to-face and remote meetings have been held with different associations and foundations, in addition to emails and telephone calls. Information has been gathered about the actions that are taking place in the destination of the city and its surroundings. On those actions planned or foreseen that have a positive impact on the city regarding the SDGs. The actions have been classified with reference to each of the SDGs goals.

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Also, additional actions have been valued that various companies have communicated. This report looks at the data that was able to be gathered, and it may contain deficiencies due to lack of information, and what should be assessed is the capacity for improvement and evolution that set destinations can prove and that serves as a pathway to the achievement of the 2030 Agenda.

Meetings were held with different agents from the city in which they defined in each case the methodology for gathering the necessary information.

SDGs ANALYSIS

In 2015 the UN approved the 2030 Agenda on sustainable development, an opportunity so that countries and their societies can start a new path with which to improve the lives of all, leaving no one behind. The Agenda has 17 Sustainable Development Goals, which include from the elimination of poverty up to combat climate change, education, woman's equality, the defence of the environment or the design of our cities.

Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) constitute a universal appeal to the action to end poverty, protect the planet and better the lives and people's perspectives worldwide.

Currently, progress is being made in many places, but, in general, the measures aimed to achieve the goals are not moving fast enough nor are on the needed scale. 2023 should mark the beginning of an ambitious post-pandemic stage in order to reach the goals for 2030.

DESCRIPTION	The project is part of the program that the MUSOL foundation has been implementing since 2017 (financed by the Valencia City Council, the Generalitat Valenciana and the AECID) and which was born from an identification process in which the need and the interest in incorporating the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs in the programming of municipal libraries.
	Work will be based on 4 axes:
	1 Support for the elaboration of public library policies aligned according to the 2030 Agenda and in the incidence in local authorities so that said policies are approved. This component focuses on taking the necessary measures to integrate the SDGs into library policies through programs, plans or other public policy instruments.
	2 Reinforcement of capacities through the improvement of training materials and the training offer aimed at library managers and promoters of activities that they schedule (librarians, storytellers and facilitators of reading clubs).
	3 Replication in 10 libraries of the Valencian Community of a comprehensive pilot experience for the inclusion of the SDGs in library services, which consists of: general activities for all centres; activities for adults (reading clubs, human libraries, etc.); activities aimed at young people (educational robotics workshops, the 3D printing, "Booktubers" etc.); activities aimed at children (storytelling, theatre, etc.). They are educational, from the perspective of global citizenship.
	4 Promotion of networking and the capitalization of good practices among municipal libraries in matters of implementation of the 2030 Agenda and the SDGs. The aim is to provide librarians with tools (the website for the exchange of information and practices) and spaces (meetings) to strengthen the "community of practice" that librarians have spontaneously launched from their libraries for the work of introducing the SDGs in libraries.
	The rights holders to whom this proposal is directed are the users of the municipal Libraries attached to the project (children, young people and adults). The project also affects the holders of obligations, particularly the political leaders and technicians from municipal libraries.

DESCRIPTION

WELLBASED is a European H2020 project whose goal is to design, implement and evaluate a comprehensive urban program to reduce energy poverty and its effects on the health and well-being of citizens. 7 European pilots participate, including València, which also coordinates the project.

Within the project and under the creation of the Citizen School for the Right to Energy, about 177 people in situations of energy poverty will be attended, with advice and personalized attention. Another group of 177 people in energy vulnerability will be the "control group" to which surveys will be carried out to know in detail their situation and design public policies that help combat the phenomenon of energy poverty.

WHAT IS THE CITIZEN SCHOOL FOR THE RIGHT TO ENERGY?

The Citizen School for the Right to Energy was born from the European project WELLBASED and aims to reclaim and raise awareness among all citizens about the Right to Energy.

Among its main purposes are:

- Helping households in the city of València to empower themselves energetically
- Advising on how to save money on energy (electricity, gas)
- Improving people's physical and mental health

How do we achieve this?

- Expert and personalized advice
- Training workshops
- Group meetings
- Open talks
- Activities to strengthen the associative fabric of the city

The School wants to be a benchmark when addressing this right through the visibility and de-stigmatization of energy poverty; a structural issue in our society that must be addressed and resolved collectively.

WHICH ORGANIZATIONS ARE PARTIES?

The Citizen School for the Right to Energy is managed by the City of València through the València Clima i Energia Foundation and its Energy Office, with the collaboration of the Las Naves Innovation Center.

ENERGY AND HEALTH

Health is usually recognized as a basic right. However, access to affordable and secure energy is not recognized as such. Having (or not) enough energy to meet basic vital needs has a major impact on people's physical and mental health.

The Citizen School for the Right to Energy was born with the aim of claiming this right and energetically empowering citizens as a whole, prioritizing those who need it most, and thus improving their health and

DESCRIPTION

The València Clima i Energía Foundation received in 2020 the acceptance by the European Union for participation in the European project H2020 Save the Homes, as a Partner, with recognition of assignment of tasks and economic subsidy to that effect.

The Save the Homes project is a project funded by the European Commission and aims to contribute to an annual increase of >5% in the rate of renovation of buildings, offering attractive one-stop services to owners. This is achieved through the implementation of "Citizen Hubs", unique windows that offer advice and support with the technical, administrative and financial problems that the residents of the city encounter during the rehabilitation processes of their buildings and homes.

The Valencian pilot is focused on the Energy Office as a one-stop information on energy rehabilitation in the city. Currently, the Energy Office addresses questions related to this area, whether through individual counselling appointments, informative workshops for several people, or the production of different teaching materials.

Within this framework, one of the actions proposed for the València pilot is the creation and dynamization of the "Citizen School of Energy Rehabilitation", which in its activity programs aims to be an open, free and flexible group of people interested in energy rehabilitation. The group allows these people to share their doubts, experiences and advice regarding the rehabilitation of their homes and buildings, in a way that encourages peer learning and a sense of community and mutual support.

Some of the main functions of the Citizen School of Energy Rehabilitation are:

- Allowing individuals to share their doubts, experiences and advice regarding the rehabilitation of their homes and buildings.
- Allowing these people to share references of companies, products, subsidies, financing, etc. among peers.
- Allowing València Clima i Energia and the Energy Office to give advice and resolve the doubts of these people, jointly.
- Inviting experts from the sector (Valencian Building Institute, IVACE, College of Estate Administrators, installers, builders, banks, etc.) to jointly solve the doubts of the participants, in addition to presenting services and information that may be of interest to
- Inspiring people to rehabilitate their homes thanks to the testimony and success stories shared by other users.

Other waterfowl, such as gulls, herons, terns, ducks, lbis, and flamingos, also benefit.			
	In addition, the benefit is double, since with these agricultural tasks the adventitious vegetation that develops in the failed rice fields is controlled and the annoying presence of weeds is reduced during the following season. The causes of these failures are diverse, often related to the excessive presence of this unwanted vegetation, the affectation of pests and diseases or adverse weather conditions.
